In the evening there is our Sunday @ 6 service.

There are no morning services today at **St Mary's** or at **All Saints** and there is no Café Church at **St Peter's** contrary to what it says in the parish magazine.

Focal Ministry has come about as part of the answer to ever-decreasing numbers of clergy looking after ever-increasing numbers of parishes. Focal Ministers are attached to a specific parish and are in effect the Incumbent's deputies, responsible for the churches and being a primary port of call for all parishioners in those places.

Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

Gospel: Luke 3.1-6

When the Gospel is announced we respond with:

Glory to you, O Lord

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Emperor Tiberius, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was ruler of Galilee, and his brother Philip ruler of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias ruler of Abilene, during the high-priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. He went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah,

'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of the Lord,

make his paths straight.

Every valley shall be filled,

and every mountain and hill shall be made low,

and the crooked shall be made straight,

and the rough ways made smooth;

and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."
