

WAY FORWARD: MOVING INTO INTERREGNUM Benefice meeting Friday, 27th June 2025

The day began with prayer we then moved into the JPH and Heather began by saying:

'There comes a time for all of us when we have to stand down from our post. What then happens to the church? Do I just 'leave them to it', or do I actively engage in planning the process of transition? The traditional way is that the Rector leaves them to it!

But I want to help, if I can.

The term 'interregnum' is an unfortunate expression - it implies that the king has departed. The truth is that the King never leaves!

This could be a most significant time for our congregation. It is a time when you can review the past with its symbols and images of identity and purpose as well as its losses and disappointments. You can begin to glimpse new opportunities made possible because of the fact that your rector has left. Above all, as a congregation, you can take responsibility for identifying new directions for your church's ministry, a new vision for your church's mission and a 'grassroots' definition of the church's purpose. This is and has always been your church.

I believe that for the sake of the ongoing well-being of our benefice It would be helpful to share my experience before I end my ministry here.

Heather explained that here has never been a typical day for her:

But that 60-70 hrs per week is normal, often more, rarely less.

Much of what I do feeds me and is life giving.

But.... There is a great deal that I have had to deal with and still encounter that drains the very life from me.

The biggest distraction for me has been people complaining, being self-centred, disagreeing and me needing to mediate and placate.

We do not come to church to worship anyone other than God. It is God we should be striving to please not ourselves.

What can you, the people of this church do to relieve pressure on the Rector?

What can you the people of this church STOP doing to relieve the pressure on the Rector?

Expectations of Rector and Rectors spouse need to be realistic and lowered.

This is not the 1980's or 1990's anymore. Church has changed.

Church changed after covid. Methodists and Catholics are also thin on ministers.

Covid changed the way in which we and our community live.

We cannot keep referring to the past.

The past is in the past.

We must look to the future not the past.

Our Benefice needs to look out to the community, not be concerned with ourselves.

The Diocese is not giving more priests there aren't more priests.

We often if not always at PCC and other meetings and gatherings spend more time focusing on ourselves and not on others. We MUST be OUTWARD looking.

But crucially, This Benefice will not fall down just because I go. This Benefice is so much more than me. I am just a tiny bit.

YOU are the Benefice and it will continue because of **you**.

We must celebrate all that we are, all that we have done and all that you will continue to do. The Interregnum is an opportunity for everyone to continue to support each other and to build on our achievements. We can flourish in our new challenges by asking God for direction, grace, love and kindness.'

There then followed a period of questions to Heather about the time of vacancy.

The most pertinent of which was 'will there be the same problem with tenants in the Rectory delaying the arrival of a new Rector'

No there will not. Because the Diocese will be letting the Rectory on 2 month long contracts.

We then watched a video recording of a sermon given by Pete Greig in early June.

The video is available on YouTube Pete Greig Awakening: A word to the church.

The sermon is 45 minutes long but we only watched the first 20 minutes.

Pete referred to a new report that has been in the news called **A Quiet Revival**, you can download the report for free from the Bible Society website.

Pete spoke of the need for our Church to WAKE UP.

Heather then explained the church of England Five marks of Mission

5 Marks of Mission

To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom **TELL**

To teach, baptise and nurture new believers TEACH

To respond to human need by loving service **TEND**

To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and to pursue peace and reconciliation **TRANSFORM**

To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth **TREASURE**

Missio Dei: God's mission not ours

Rosie and James then led us in answering some missional questions.

The questions and the answers given are recorded below.

Six missional questions a church can ask:

Q1: Do we provide opportunities for people to explore the Christian faith?

We are the ones serving not receiving.

Things we do, many were mentioned including: Alpha, Bible study, services, magazine, information in our porches, sermons, chatting to people, gossiping the gospel, social media, coffee cake and chat, visiting, and random acts of kindness.

Q2: Are we a learning community where members grow in the knowledge of God and the scriptures, a deepening life of prayer and worship, acts of loving service and witness?

What does it mean to us in our actual life and the way we live? People need to understand that being a Christian is life changing. Deanery synod speakers recently were excellent and gave a different perspective, we should get them and other speakers to our churches.

Minister/give to people where they are.

How do we learn to witness to our faith? Witness is being with people so that they want what we have. People will not want to find out about church and God if we are miserable and always complaining about church and falling out with each other.

Could we have stewards in church every day to greet people as we do on Thursdays in St John's? How about a Christian/church stall on market day?

We need to make more use of coffee time after church to talk about faith/the sermon.

What about a testimony slot, not just in services.

EVERYTHING must be under pinned by prayer and scripture.

Q3: Are we growing relationships that are loving and honest, able to work through conflict, celebrating unity in diversity? Where is our love overflowing naturally? How will this be visible and accessible?

We are not good at being honest in our feelings and working through conflict. We need to be better.

When we ask 'how are you?' we need to mean it and lister to the response. Respect each other. Listen to each other. Respect each other's opinions and the outcome.

Relationships have got to be reflective of the relationship that we have with God.

Must put our relationship with Jesus first.

There is a difference between hierarchy and grassroots church.

How do we disassociate ourselves from those who bring the church into disrepute.

Q4: Are we a welcoming and hospitable community?

All our churches in the benefice are welcoming and show hospitality. We do funerals well, welcoming people as they arrive. Not everyone stays to coffee after church.

Many wonderful comments in our visitors' books.

Q5: Where does the church actively engage with the wider community?

So many events both regular and one offs: Gift from St John's, Harvest suppers, Monday meet and eat, coffee mornings, being part of the community, talking to people at community events we attend. Magazine.

Be alive to what people are saying. Ask who are you not, what do you do. The wider community is The World; we give to and pray for places in the wider world.

Mission partners - we need to know more about them.

Could we have more social activities in the churches like the barn dance, quiz and advertise widely.

Q6: What is one thing we could do to make a difference to the lives of the people living in the parish?

The note taker did not hear/record any answers to this question as we moved on to 3 further questions, for the vacancy and to help our church wardens.

- 1. What do we do already?
- 2. Who does it?
- 3. How do we share the load?

We need to get some of our younger members to help more.

Suggestion to ask for volunteers for a task and promise you will only have to do the task once a year. Hope that many people volunteer!

We ended the morning with a song – In Christ Alone and prayer:

Dear Heavenly Father,

As we face the future as a community of your people in this place,

May we know afresh your faithful love, and see afresh your loving faithfulness.

May it be these - may it be You -

For whom we yearn in every season.

May it be your words of life for which we listen, and by which alone we live.

With lightly-held reverence for our past, and with hearts full, help us with courage and wisdom and freedom to welcome and to pursue and to participate in the new things you are doing in and around and despite us, and beyond.

Continue to raise up those who will serve your people with humility, and with deep humanity bear witness to your Good News.

May we dare to dream and to risk what we have never imagined – free, unencumbered, joyous, just, obedient.

And along the way, save us from empty slogans, from senseless controversies, and from the delusion that we are at the centre of your work around here.

God before and God behind, For all that has been – thanks. For all that will be – Yes!

We pray in the name of Jesus, in whom we see you a little more fully and ourselves a little more clearly. Amen.
